#### Phonology contributes <u>indirectly</u>, by identifying words. Sometimes directly, through sound play.


















There is a grammatical system. Grammatical systems differ.







### Grammar affects overall meaning primarily by <u>contrast</u>.

### Aorist as the Default

#### Aorist infinitive and aorist imperative are <u>normal</u>.

The speaker says, "No further comment."

"sudden event," "once-for-all action," "decisive action," "point action" are <u>overreadings</u>.


# **Example of Fine Difference**




**Principles for Referential** Subsystem

There is a referential system. Referential systems differ. You can say anything if you take enough time.














# **Goal in Interpreting Sense**

Don't detect what isn't there. (Maximal interpretation is not best.)
You never exhaust meaning.
