- 1. Rider on white horse 6:1-2
- 2. Rider on red horse 6:3-4
- 3. Rider on black horse 6:5-6
- 4. Rider on pale horse 6:7-8
- 5. Souls of martyrs 6:9-11
- 6. Cosmic judgment of Second Coming 6:12-17
- (Promise: sealing; many nations 7:1-17)
- 7. Introducing God 8:1

Meaning of the Riders

- Compare with Zech. 1:8-17, where four riders are God's scouts and angelic agents.
- Each brings a particular judgment.
 - **■**White: conquest
 - ■Red: war
 - **■Black:** famine
 - **■**Pale: death
- Christ the Lamb governs all of the ...






Roman Empire View (Preterist)

• Beckwith (pp. 334-35): "the book [is] fulfilled in the destruction of Jerusalem and the fall of the Roman Empire."




Final Crisis View (Futurist)

• Fulfillment occurs in the events of the final crisis immediately preceding the Second Coming.




Church History View (Historicist)

- Morris (p. 17): "setting out ... the history of western Europe ... until the second coming of Christ."
- Rev 6-19 is in chronological order.




Repeated Pattern View (Idealist)

• Tenney (p. 143): "... represents the eternal conflict of good and evil which persists in every age."







E. Wrapping Up the Cycle of Seals

The Promise-Interlude (7:1-17)

 Promise of protection and security for the saints assures us in the midst of distress.



Interpreting the 144,000

- Symbolic meaning for numbers
 - 7 indicates completeness, Rev. 15:1; Gen. 2:1-3.
 - 1000 indicates a large amount, 2 Pet. 3:8.
 - 12 indicates the people of God, Luke 22:29; Rev. 21:12-14.
 - 4 indicates the four directions of the compass, encompassing all the earth, Zech. 6:5.
- 12,000 in Rev. $7 = 12 \times 1000$, people of God in their multitude.

Seventh Seal: Silence in 8:1

- Silence in awe of God's presence, as in Hab. 2:20; Isa. 41:1; Zeph. 1:7; Zech. 2:13.
- When God appears, he makes a new world. But the vision of this new world is delayed until Rev. 21-22.
