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



Type of offering **Burnt**

Grain
Fellowship
Sin
Guilt

Purpose

Dedication to God; penalty for sin Tribute from labor

Fellowship meal

Cleansing from sin

A variation of sin offering: cleansing from offenses with regard to holy things



OT offering

Fulfillment in Christ

Burnt offering Grain offering Christ makes you holy Christ presents you to God

Fellowship Sin, guilt offering Christ gives communion Christ cleanses your sin

You die with Christ (Col. 2:20; Rom. 6:3-5)


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










Sprinkling Blood

Blood signifies life (Lev. 17:11).

Offering the Fat

The fat is the best (sweet tasting), Deut. 32:14; Ps. 63:5; Isa. 25:6; Gen. 45:18.

God gets the best, Gen. 4:4; Mal. 1:8.

Christ's offering is divinely perfect, Heb. 7:26; 9:14.

You are now perfected, Heb. 10:10, 14.



Apply Offering the Fat

I avoid fat to keep my weight down.

God deserves the best!

Back then, fat was the best part.





Dealing with the Flesh

The flesh is burned, or eaten by priest, or eaten by worshiper.

A benefit to God, to priest, or to worshiper.

Christ <u>is</u> the priest, he benefits God, and he benefits you.
