# A. Kind of Literature in Genesis 1-3

#### Two Classifications

#### By Content

- Creation
- Major groups of things (Gen. 1)
- Purposes (Gen. 2)
- Results (Gen. 3)
- Ps. 104; 8; Col. 1:15-17

#### By Form and Style

- Prose or poetry?
- Narrative or exposition?
- 1-2 Samuel

#### Genesis 1:1-5

narrative tense

In the beginning, God created the keavens and the earth. The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters. And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. And God saw that the light was good. And God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

#### Classification of Genesis

- Prose (poetry in 1:27 has parallel lines)
- Narrative (time in focus)

### Nonfiction versus Fiction

And he said, "I may not return with you, or go in with you, neither will I eat bread nor drink water with you in this place, for it was said to me by the word of the LORD, 'You shall neither eat bread nor drink water there, nor return by the way that you came." And he said to him, "I also am a prophet as you are, and an angel spoke to me by the word of the LORD, saying, 'Bring him back with you into your house that he may eat bread and drink water." But he lied to him. So he went back with him and ate bread in his house and drank water. – 1 Kings 13:16-19

### Genesis as Nonfiction

- Integrated with Exodus through 2 Kings
- Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph as real
- Ancestors of the people of Israel
- Customs match ancient environment (Abraham marrying his half sister)

#### Genesis 1-3

- Part of a continuous narrative
- Organized by "these are the generations of ..." (Gen. 2:4; 5:1; 6:9; 10:1; 11:10, 27; etc.)
- Genesis 1 has repetitions (exalted prose):
  - "And God said"
  - "And God saw that it was good"
  - "And there was evening and there was morning"
- But also repetitions in Num. 7

#### B. Confirmation from OT and NT

#### OT Back References: 1 Chronicles

Adam, Seth, Enosh; Kenan, Mahalalel, Jared; Enoch, Methuselah, Lamech; Noah, Shem, Ham, and Japheth. (1:1-4)

#### OT Back References: Ps. 8:6-8

You have given him dominion over the works of your hands; you have put all things under his feet, all sheep and oxen, and also the beasts of the field, the birds of the heavens, and the fish of the sea, whatever passes along the paths of the seas.

#### Jesus' Endorsement of the OT

He answered, "Have you not read that <u>he</u> who created them from the beginning made them male and female, and <u>said</u>, 'Therefore a man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and they shall become one flesh'?" – Matt. 19:4-5, with quote from Gen. 2:24.

#### Jesus' Endorsement of the OT: 2

"Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to <u>fulfill them</u>. For truly, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the Law until all is accomplished." – Matt. 5:17-18

#### Jesus' Endorsement of the OT: 3

And the tempter came and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command these stones to become loaves of bread." But he answered, "It is written, " Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God.''' – Matt. 4:3-4; quoted from Deut. 8:3

### D. Genesis 1-3 and Science

#### Different Focus

#### the Bible

- Redemptive: God, Christ, sin
- To all peoples
- Common language
- Focus on persons
- Ordinary experience
- Sparse description

#### science

- Informative
- To specialists
- Technical
- Focus on mechanism
- Hidden structures
- Massive detail, mathematical precision

### **Implications**

# the Bible: common language

- Framework for all
- Truth, even in detail,
  but not technical
- Easy to overread in a scientific direction

# science: technical

- Fit into biblical frame
- Current state of "knowledge"
- Easy to overread larger human implications

- Analogy: Jesus as true man
- Water into wine







### Spirit as Source of Life

#### Psalm 104:30:

When you hide your face, they [animals] are dismayed;

when you take away their <u>breath</u>, they die and return to their dust.

When you send forth your <u>Spirit</u>, they are created,

and you renew the face of the ground.

### Conclusion on Homologies

# Evaluation of Hypotheses: Eve

- Adam's rib represents discontinuity
- Figurative? No.
- Compatible with genetic continuity
- A good test of whether supernatural is allowed

### Evaluation of Hypotheses: Adam

- A radically new Adam
- Silence about details
