


Christ as Center of Creation

Colossians 1:16: "For by him [Christ] all things were created, ..."


Colossians 1:17: "... and in him all things hold together."


He is foundation as well as agent.

















Christ as Origin of the World

John 1:1-2: allusion to Genesis

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God.

<u>John 1:3-4</u>:

"All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made.

In him was life, and the life was the light of men."


Life in Christ


John 5:26: "For as the Father has life in himself, so he has granted the Son also to have life in himself."

In the eye of the beholder!







Other Analogies from God

1. Image of the Word

The Word with God (original) Word spoken to create Human speech Animal calls Information stored materially DNA





2. The Spirit as Origin of Life

Psalm 104:30:

"When you send forth your Spirit, they [animals] are created, and you life renew the face of the ground."

Romans 8:10: But if Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is <u>life</u> because of righteousness."

The Spirit Empowers

- Spirit empowers the virgin birth (Luke 1:35)
- "The Spirit is life" (Rom. 8:10)
- Analogous to breath from God (Ezek. 37)
- Human beings given breath
 - God "breathed into his nostrils the breath of life" (Gen. 2:7)
 - "the spirit in man, the breath of the Almighty" (Job 32:8)

The Spirit Sustains

<u>Job 34:14-15</u>:

If he [God] should set his heart to it and gather to himself his <u>spirit</u> and his <u>breath</u>, <u>all flesh</u> would perish together, and man would return to dust."

The Spirit Empowers Lower Life

Animals breathe ("breath of life" Gen. 7:22)
Plants breathe ("respiration")
Cells breathe (oxygen for metabolism)
Chemical reaction for metabolism

Meaning of God's Presence

Creator-creature Distinction


- Absolutely transcendent God
- Distinct creation
- God present controlling and judging
- Intimacy between God and creatures
- Distinct <u>orders</u> within creation
 - Personal creatures: Angels; Human beings
 - Animals
 - Plants
 - Nonliving things
- Spirit present to all, but <u>distinctively</u> to each




Pantheism and Emanation

- World absorbed in god
- God present in divinization
- Identity between God and creatures
- Distinct <u>orders</u> within creation dissolved
- Spirit present to all, making everything Spirit/spirit

Biblical Worldview Absolutely Transcendent God **Distinct creation** God present controlling and judging Intimacy between God and creatures **Distinct** orders within creation - Personal creatures: Angels; Human beings – Animals – Plants Nonliving things Spirit present to all, but <u>distinctively</u> to each







Purpose in Machines

A machine is <u>designed</u> to do something.

- Background of <u>rational</u>, <u>purposeful</u> intelligence






Purpose in Visual Processing

"Vision, for example, <u>begins its journey</u> when the radiant energy of light triggers electrical activity in the approximately one hundred million primary light receptor cells that comprise the retina. Each cell records the level of brightness (or color) that touches design it in each instance of time; the image transmitted through the lens is thus picked up as a pattern of electrical signals." -- Edward O. Wilson, <u>On Human Nature</u> (1978)




Omnipotence of the Father

- Son as executor of power; Spirit as energizer
 Human choice and control
