And God said, "Let the earth sprout vegetation, ..." (Gen. 1:11)



Romans 1:19-20

For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them. For his invisible attributes, namely, <u>his eternal power and divine nature</u>, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made.
